Program Description:

This course is an excellent means by which to satisfy several primal summer urges: to travel, to be outside, and to edify your mind. Students will receive close instruction in traditional disciplinary skills (how to read literary and persuasive texts analytically, as well as how to compose incisive commentary). Students will also develop their proficiency in new media technologies, including blogging, to analyze London and the literature inspired by this great city. Our “classroom” changes every day, for we will discuss culture in its socio-historical context at some of the most significant historical and cultural sites in London, including the Royal Maritime Museum, St. Paul’s Cathedral, Kenwood House, Tate Britain, Tate Modern, the British Museum, the Victoria and Albert Museum, the Imperial War Museum, Leighton House, the Sherlock Holmes Museum, the British Library, and more.
